## BILL SPOTLIGHT

[SB 776 \(Skinner\) Peace officer: release of records](#)

"SB 776 is a continued attempt to release records of peace officers regardless of whether allegations are substantiated, hurting the personal lives of officers without due process.

Further, requiring peace officers to self-report all uses of force to their department or agency is overly broad and burdensome, as local law enforcement agencies use of force policies vary. Under SB 776, records would have to be released any time an officer simply touches another person. We believe this section could lead to abuse by departments and grounds for terminating peace officers for unknowingly neglecting to notify a department when force is applied." - Capital Advocacy

## SAFEGUARDING AMERICA'S FIRST RESPONDERS ACT

Patrick Yoes, National President of the Fraternal Order of Police, applauded today's news that President Donald J. Trump signed S. 3607, the "Safeguarding America's First Responders Act," into law.

The law, which was introduced by Senators Chuck Grassley (R-IA) and Corey A. Booker (D-NJ), establishes a statutory presumption that law enforcement or other public safety officers who die or become disabled from COVID-19 or complications related to COVID-19 did so because they sustained a personal injury in the line of duty, provided that the officer engaged in line-of-duty actions between 1 January 2020 and 31 December 2021.
