BILL SPOTLIGHT

[SB-731 \(Bradford\) Peace Officers: certification: civil rights](#)

The review committee contained in SB 731, is comprised of individuals with an **anti-police agenda**, and they outweigh law enforcement representatives 6-3.

The review committee contained in SB 731 would be able to reconsider and overturn an underlying administrative action by a department – effectively creating **double jeopardy**. Not only could this committee overturn the underlying decision it could do so without offering a fair hearing or appeal process.

An officer could be terminated, and their license pulled under SB 731's definition of serious misconduct for a traffic ticket or swearing in public. (see SEC. 14, Section 13510.8 2(b)(6).

This bill removes qualified immunity. Forcing officers to carry personal liability coverage against civil claims. This job is full of conflict. These officers will be buried in litigation, cost, and financial ruin. **NO ONE will do this job.** It is unclear to us in an environment where police budgets are being cut - ostensibly pay is frozen, and costs continue to rise, that police are now expected to carry and pay for personal liability insurance coverage. - Capital Advocacy

The CAFOP OPPOSES this bill.

SAFEGUARDING AMERICA'S FIRST RESPONDERS ACT

Patrick Yoes, National President of the Fraternal Order of Police, applauded today's news that President Donald J. Trump signed S. 3607, the "Safeguarding America's First Responders Act," into law.

The law, which was introduced by Senators Chuck Grassley (R-IA) and Corey A. Booker (D-NJ), establishes a statutory presumption that law enforcement or other public safety officers who die or become disabled from COVID-19 or complications related to COVID-19 did so because they sustained a personal injury in the line of duty, provided that the officer engaged in line-of-duty actions between 1 January 2020 and 31 December 2021.
