Governor Newsom Takes Final Action of 2020 Legislative Season

[AB 1196](#) by Assembly member Gipson (D-Carson) which bans the practice ending the use of the carotid restraint statewide - **SIGNED**

[AB 1299](#) by Assembly member Salas (D- Bakersfield) regarding peace officer employment - **VETOED**

[AB 1506](#) by Assembly member McCarty (D-Sacramento) requiring the California Attorney General to conduct investigations into officer-involved shootings of unarmed individuals that result in death. - **SIGNED**

[AB 2655](#) by Assembly member Gipson (D-Carson) Invasion of privacy: first responders would make it a misdemeanor for a first responder who responds to the scene of an accident or crime to capture the photographic image of a deceased person for any purpose other than an official law enforcement purpose or a genuine public interest - **SIGNED**

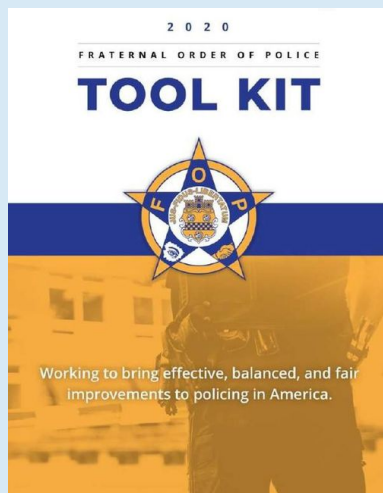
Grassroots Public Relations and Media Toolkit
