Legislative Update

Washington, D.C.

H.R. 1280 - "George Floyd Justice in Policing Act"

On March 3, 2021 the House of Representatives passed H.R. 1280 a major police reform bill. This bill is now in the Senate and the Senate Democrats will have to sway at least 10 Senate Republicans for the bill to pass. A similar bill was passed by the House of Representatives last year, however it failed to pass out of Senate.

Here are a few things this bill would do if passed.

- End Qualified Immunity for Law Enforcement Officers
- Ban Choke and Carotid Holds
- Ban No Knock Warrants
- Nationally Fund Body Cameras
- Establish a Police Misconduct Registry
- Change the Police Prosecution Standard from "Willfulness" to "Recklessness".

**NATIONAL FOP PRESIDENT STATEMENT ON THE
GEORGE FLOYD JUSTICE IN POLICING ACT**

Our members are disappointed that the U.S. House of Representatives has decided to move H.R. 1280, the "George Floyd Justice in Policing Act" directly to the floor—without Committee consideration or any real debate on meaningful amendments. This is the same bill that was unable to gain any traction in the previous Congress because there was a lack of genuine dialogue and engagement.

This bill contains provisions that we believe, after good faith discussions, could have a positive impact on law enforcement and policing in our country. There are other provisions, like ending the doctrine of qualified immunity, which we strongly oppose. Without debate or discussion, these issues cannot be resolved.

We share the sentiments of Congress and the public we are sworn to protect with respect to policing reform. All of us have a stake in safe communities. When our citizens do not feel safe in the presence of police, that's a problem—and the FOP intends to be part of the solution.

We look forward to engaging with the Administration, Members of the House and Senate, and stakeholder groups in the days ahead to find consensus on issues of vital national concern and produce a bill that can pass not just the House, but also the Senate with broad and bipartisan support.

The FOP is focused on having fact-based discussions about how to improve policing in our country and we hope that we are afforded that opportunity later in the legislative process.

FOP Legal Defense Plan

FOP RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT CONCEALED CARRY COVERAGE

The current HR-218 Plan coverage will be replaced with the FOP Retired Law Enforcement Concealed Carry Legal Defense Coverage (CCC). The expanded coverage will offer Unlimited Legal Defense for civil and criminal claims associated with the legal carrying and/or use of a weapon: all reasonable and necessary Legal Defense Costs are now covered in full when using a Plan Attorney. This new expanded Plan will provide coverage not only for those retirees who were qualified under LEOSA, but also those retirees who are qualified under their own state laws to carry a concealed weapon.

To submit a CCC Application, please fill out the form at the link below. You will receive your ID card, plan booklet and certificate of participation within 30 days after the approval of your application.

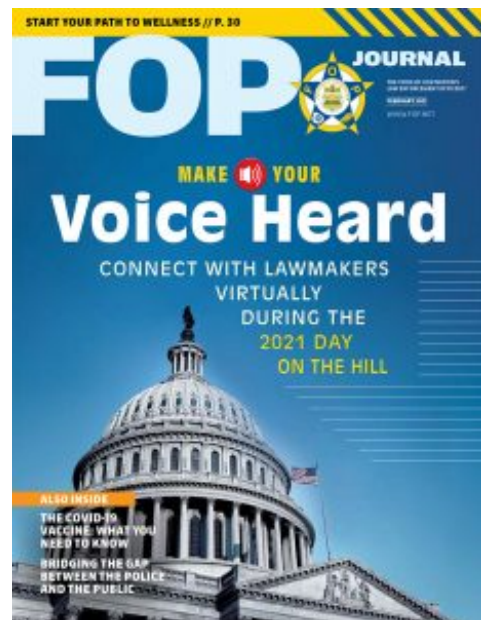
